Notre Dame Cathedral is one of the oldest the most memorable buildings in the history of France. People gathered around the cathedral to watch the beautiful parts of the structure fall, praying and watching in disbelief. It was a sad day for architectural history and the world. The original design of Notre Dame, looking back at the images of this Gothic cathedral, it is almost impossible to believe that the original construction of this masterpiece occurred more than 800 years ago. Construction began during the reign of King Louis VII in 1163. Located in the Ile de la Cite, in the middle of the River Seine in Paris, the construction of the cathedral took 182 years from start to finish. It was officially completed in 1345. Notre Dame is one of the oldest buildings in Paris While the Eiffel Tower is another iconic structure to symbolize the City of Lights, it's actually not as old as Notre Dame. The Eiffel Tower was built in 1887 and was completed two years later in 1889. Both structures are important to the history of this city, but in terms of years, Notre Dame is by far the oldest to date. Even the famous Arc de Triomphe in the center of Charles de Gaulle's field did not come close in age. Construction began in 1806, 643 years after the initial construction of Notre Dame. However, all these Parisian masterpieces have one thing in common: hidden rooms, which builders keep secret. This is not the first tragedy that occurred for Notre Dame, the cathedral was once in a deplorable stage and close to the point of demolition, but was soon saved by Napoleon. He was crowned emperor in 1804 in the cathedral. The cathedral was also threatened during World War II by German soldiers who said they could destroy Rose's stained glass window, which is the largest glass window in the world. In order to preserve this 13th century beauty, the stained glass windows were removed and then replaced after the war. It was reported that after the recent fires, Rose's window remained intact. This is also not the first restoration of the cathedral. The magnificent spire was actually a copy of the original, which was removed in 1786 for being uncoordinated. It was rebuilt in the 1860s. The famous gargoyles around the structure are also new, which occurred in the 19th century restoration of the cathedral. The fire was not the first sign of trouble in early 2018, CBS News reported, citing Notre Dame's announcement of the building's renovation. It is currently undergoing \$6.8 million in repairs, mostly focused on a spire that is made of 250 tons of lead. Problems in the cathedral were noticed when cracks began to appear in the stone, a serious sign that the structure was unstable. Although the roof (made of 5,000 oaks) caught fire, the New York Times claimed that Notre Dame is still structurally sound after the devastating fire. As the fire investigations continue, there seems to still be hope for this inimi something structure to once again stand in all its majestic glory.
